CARLISLE INDIAN GOES WEST WITH HIS HANDS IN IRONS House The Indian School Authorities Declare He

Is Being Returned to Reservation

For Bad Behavior

At the request of the Carlisle Indian School authorities Saturday night, Joseph Northrup, a young Indian and a former student at Carlisle, was arrested in Union Station as he was about to take a train for Carlisle. He had just returned from Washington.

The school authorities said Northrup had been sent to his reservation in Minnesota because of serious infractions of school discipline and that his ticket West had been pur-chased for him. He refused to leave this section of the country, however, and instead of going West went to Washington, He was on his way back to Carlisle, the school authorities supposed Saturday; hence the request that he be locked up until a disciplinarian from the school could get here to take him West. Yester-day afternoon the government school officer arrived and Northrup, with his hands manacled, started for Minnesota.

Northrup, who is young and apparently quiet and well mannered, told Detective Frank, who arrested him, that he supposed he was wanted in Minnesota for shooting another Indian. There had been a quarrel long ago, Northrup confessed, and he shot the man who he afterwards learned had died as a result of the wound.

The Carlisle school authorities knew nothing of this story, they said. They further declared that Northrup is not to be delivered to any authorities in Minnesota other than those in charge of his reservation.

SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a nonreservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

NOTE

Age limits, fourteen to twenty years. Preferably fourteen to eighteen. Students must be at least one-fourth Indian, preferably full Indian. Special cases beyond the age limit will be given consideration. An industrial course only can be taken and the term reduced to three years, in exceptional cases.

INDORSEMENTS

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian thild beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that-

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservation or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.
