Dear Mr. Cavill:

Your letter of July 10, addressed to the Carlisle Indian School, was forwarded here for reply.

After the Carlisle School closed in 1918 the records were transferred to this Office. In some cases these records are incomplete for the reason that sometimes a student's record was sent to another school to which the student transferred, and sometimes the records were sent to the agency superintendent.

We have located a Carlisle file for Thomas Fraser Tiosh, a full blood Chippewa Indian. The record shows that he entered Carlisle on March 31, 1896 for a period of five years. He was, however expelled from the school on December 6, 1900. The record for Mr. Tiosh is very incomplete and does not contain his application for enrollment or any information regarding his studies.

There is a form entitled "Record of Graduates and Returned Students, U. S. Indian School, Carlisle, Pa.", dated June, 1911, apparently filled out by Mr. Tiosh, which states that after leaving Carlisle he attended the LeAnse High School, 1902-03. This record further shows that he worked at his trade at Ashland, Wisconsin for the Toney Noodle Shoe Department, and in the sawmill of the C. H. Hebard Company, Pequaming, Michigan. No dates are given as to the period of employment in either case.

For your further information, the Carlisle Indian School did not go beyond the eighth grade level in academic work and certain vocational training was offered. Under the outing system, it was possible for a student to be enrolled at the school and attend the neighboring public schools, thereby graduating from high school.

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
