CREEKS WILL FIGHT

The Honorable Commissioner of Indian Affairs is making a determined fight against the pernicious inluence of whiskey among the Indians. His stand has been so fearless in the matter that the press of the country has highly commended him and in many instances used his arguments and views for their own communities. What has undoubtedly pleased the Commissioner more than this, is the lining up with him in the fight of the Indians themselves.

The thinking Indain has rallied to the banner and we give below an extract from the official record of the recent Extra-Ordinary Session of the National Council of the Creek Nation, convened by authority of an act of Congress, which is one of many signs that the Indian appreciates the seriousness of the efforts now being made to give him a chance.

Resolution

Whereas; The present greatest foe, threatning the health, the wealth, the moral and social standing of the Indian race, is the Demon drink which operates upon every fiber of his being, the effect of which is to destroy his intellect, dethrone his reason, waste his estate, and in the end consign him to a pauper's grave; and

Whereas, as members of the Creek National Council, many of us represent, in our humble capacity, the places made vacant by the deaths of our ancestors; considered then, as we consider them now, honorable and high positions of great trust, entrusted by the masses of one of the greatest Tribes of Indians of all history; and

Whereas, we realize these things and further realize the splendid effort the Honorable Cato Sells, as Commissioner of Indian Affairs is making to prevent the sale or other disposition of intoxicants among us and desiring to help him in his fight, and to otherwise set an example for our children to follow;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND ENACTED:

Section one. That it shall be unlawful for any member of either House of the Creek National Council to use, in any form, any kind of spirituous, intoxicating, fermented or malt liquors, wines or other beverages;

Section two. Any mber of the Creek National Council who shall have been found guilty by a majority vote of the House of which he is a member, of having violated Section One (1) of this act, shall thereby forfeit his offlice, and thereupon his successor shall be appointed by the Principal Chief from the two? represented by such member.

Section Three. This act to become diffective from and after its passage by the Council and approval by

the Principal Chie!.
