I have received your letter of January the 12th and am pleased to note therein that you give so much of the credit for the augusts you have achieved to the training that was given you while you were enrolled at Carlisle. It is also gratifying to know that you are new anxious to have your son enrol at Carlisle with his friend, Joe Turns Back Plenty.

However, in regard to the enrolment of the young men, I must advise that but very few students have been received during the past several months because there has not been room to accompdate them. At present our funds available for transportation have become so nearly hypothecated that only those students who can pay for their transportation may be admitted. If such arrangements can be made for your son and his friend I will consider applications for their enrolment if they are approved by Superintendent Estep and he recommends the boys for enrolment.
