Dear friend:

I have your letter saying that you are an old student of this school and wish to enroll as a student at the Ford factory now and would like the school to help you get in. I am sorry I am not able to help you get into the students course there. The only ones I can help are those who are willing to come to Carlisle and take the preliminary course we have for our regular students who wish to go to the Ford factory. As this would not be practicable in your case I cannot do anything for you.

Mr. Charles Dagenett, the Supervisor of Indian Employment, at Washington, D. C. has helped several of the older students to get into some of the automobile factories in Detroit and other towns, and I would suggest that you write to him as I believe he can ^{do} more for you than I can.
