As this would not be practicable in your case I cannot do anything for you.

Mr. Charles Dagenett, the Supervisor of Indian Employment, at Washington, D. C. has helped several of the older students to get into some of the automobile factories in Detroit and other towns, and I would suggest that you write to him as I believe he can ^{do} more for you than I can.
