I have your letter asking me to help you get into the Students Course at the Ford Factory and have to advise that it will not be possible for me to do this. We have made it a rule that those young men who want to join our Ford Class, should first come to Carlisle and take the preparatory work here. We have a class selected now for the June party. The next class will not likely go up until December 1917.

Semetime ago we made an effort to get into the Students' Course, one of our ex-students who had an excellent record but were refused by the authorities there. We therefore decided not to recommend any except those who came to Carlisle and joined one of the regular classes.
