We have made it a rule that those young men who want to join our Ford Class, should first come to Carlisle and take the preparatory work here. We have a class selected now for the June party. The next class will not likely go up until December 1917.

Course, one of our ex-students who had an excellent record but were refused by the authorities there. We therefore decided not to recommend any except these who came to Carlisle and joined one of the regular classes. We carry these on our outing list and a certain pertion of their earnings dea sent to the school each pay day.
