My dear Friend:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your favor of April the 15th, containing the very favorable information that you are yet employed at the ice and power plant at Winslow and that there are fifteen Indian boys under your direct authority. The position of responsibility in which you have been placed is the very best recommendation for you, and it is sufficient proof that your efforts are appreciated and that your work is satisfactory.

The boys you refer to in your letter can be given permission to enroll at Carlisle after the opening of the new fiscal year on July the 1st, providing that satisfactory applications to cover their transfers are sent to me thru the office of Superintendent Lonergan of the Pueblo Day Schools. It can then be determined whether the expense of sending you with the boys as escort may be incurred.

Hoping that I shall have your farther co-operation in this matter and that you will let me hear from you again
