

#### Great Gobs of Gas.

It is stated that the Creek County Gas company controls a 300,000,000 feet supply of gas with about thirty wells in the field not yet connected up. During the past year it has been supplying three oil refineries and other manufacturing plants and is now laying a six-inch pipe line to Bigheart, with the desigh of delivering about 50,000,000 feet of gas daily to various Kansas companies. This is strictly a Cushing proposition originating and having headquarters here.
