For and in consideration of the United States assuming the care, education, and maintenance in the United States Indian School at Carlisle, Pa., of Lawrence Isham, M., I, Lawrence Isham (Name of child.) (Sex.) (Parent, guardian, or next of kin.) of Hayward P. O., State of Wis., do hereby voluntarily consent and agree to my enrollment in said school for a period of three years, and also obligate and bind myself to abide by all the rules and regulations for Indian schools. (Not less than 3.)

I further say that the said child was born at Chippewa Falls, Wis. June 4, 1890 (Date.) that the father, Ira O. Isham, is a 1/2 Indian of the Chippewa (Name of father.) (Is or was.) (Degree.) Tribe located at Hayward Agency; that he left the tribe about (Approximate date.) that the mother, Mary Isham, is a 1/2 Indian of the Chippewa (Name.) (Is or was.) (Degree.) INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other non-reservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.

Dear Friend:

I have your letter of November 13th, and am pleased to know of your employment at the Ft. Sill Boarding School as disciplinarian.

I regret that you found it necessary to desert at the time you did, and hope that you will make such a good record from now on as to wipe that bad mark off. It is a mistake for students to leave their school prematurely in the way you did before their education is completed, and it only on very rare occasions when they would be justified in terminating their schooling, even in a legitimate way.
