Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of September 5, 1913, with reference to co-operating in arranging for the return to Carlisle for an additional period of George and Benton Lavatta. I have also received a letter from Mrs. Lavatta requesting me to co-operate in this matter.

I am heartily in favor of these boys returning for an additional period of three or five years, and I am willing to do all in my power to bring about such an enrollment; but I am doubtful whether anything can be done. The boys have taken to reservation life, have attended various fairs in the vicinity, like prancing horses, jingling spurs, chaps, leather cuffs and other makeup of the typical Indian cowboy. But if anything can be done to get them to return I assure you I will do all in my power.
