My Dear friend:

I recd, your kind and welcome invitation asking me to come to the Commencement of the dear old school of Carlisle. I am very sorry to say that I can not come this year. My work keeps me so close, that it would be impossible for me to come just at this time. As I want to purchase a little more land and have a larger outing for my children. As I have retired from Blacksmithing and have rented my shop and tools out by the year. So I ~~intend~~ to get a good poultry farm. I want to go into the poultry business and I ~~like~~ to have enough land to raise all the feed I would need for them. Of course we all have our

rent from the Government. But
will be a poultry farm, of not more
than twenty acres. So you see I am trying
to be a progressive Indian. I have to
stay close to Business. Having seven
allotment to look after a house and
Blacksmith shop and tools. also to
collect rent from. I am sure if I
can keep my health I will be able
to come next year if you wish me
to.

William Lonewolf, who is referred to in your letter of November the 29th, was enrolled at this school from July the 4th of 1892 to September the 26th of 1895, but he is not a graduate. The information on file here regarding him indicates that he had a very good record and that he was industrious. I do not know him personally, but those of the employees here who knew him have assured me that he was a good worker.

I have also learned that William Lonewolf possessed a greater degree of Negro than Indian blood and that he secured his rights as an Indian by being adopted into the Kiowa Tribe by an Indian named Lone Wolf.
