I'm very glad you wrote to me, its a long time since I left Carlisle school, and I've always got along good. I will tell you whats going on, on our reservation. We have a big saw mill here, and it is claimed to be the best in this part of the country. This mill makes all kinds of lumber, we also have a big lumber yard. We have a big planing mill too. both



our logs to the mill, and we have started to put in a rail-road, and we are going to put in lots more, and connect with towns out side of the reservation. We have an electric power house to light up the town, the saw-mill, planing mill, and private houses. We have also a 300 acre stock farm where we will raise stock to do our logging and so forth. We have a lot of buildings built for employees, and we have too a large hotel for them. We have a big office building. We got a quite a town here. We have Indian

We have a lot of nice  
horses too, to do our logging.  
We log both summer and  
winter. On our streams we  
have nice big dams built  
for driving logs to the mill.  
This will be all for this  
time hoping to hear from  
you soon. send me the  
school catalogue, the papers
