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Descent.

Frank Godfrey's line of Indian decent is as follows:--- his father John Godfrey died early in 1904 at saloon kept by him, of gun-shot said to have been fired by his son John who claims revolver accidentally discharged in father's hands during altercation.

The father was son of James R. Godfrey full blood Indian descended from the Miami War chief Francis Godfrey, and Archange (Indian name Mongosequeh) daughter of Marie Louise Richardville Alias ~~La~~ Bland who was one of the two daughters of Jean Baptiste Richardville (Indian name Peshawa) Principal chief of the Miami Nation.

Location.

In 1818 by the treaty of St Mary's Ohio 2 sections ~~on~~ the east and 3 sections ~~on~~ the west bank of the St Mary's River a few miles above Fort Wayne Indiana, was carved out of the lands ceded by the Miami Nation for and afterwards patented to J. B. Richardville .

Chief Richardville resided on that tract till his death upward of 20 years later and his ^{s n} ~~deced~~ ^{ants} for the most part have since lived there.

By the treaty of 1838 Chief Richardville and his family were permitted to remain in Indiana when the tribe should remove west, and were to be paid their annuities, there.

The band of Mashingomesia was ~~afterward~~ by a similar provision allowed to remain in Indiana. Treaty Nov^r 28/40 Art. 7.
