JURE INJURED NEAR OAK GLEN

Leon Jure, employee of the Pioneer Transfer Company, was seriously injured yesterday afternoon when the heavy truck he was driving turned over as he was coming down grade to Redlands from Oak Glen. Jure's injuries will not be fatal, although he is badly cut and bruised about the head and body and was unconscious for the better part of an hour after the accident. He was taken to his home here and his condition this morning reported much improved.

Jure had been to Oak Glen for a load of apples and the truck was heavily loaded with fruit when it turned over. The brake on the truck burned out at one of the steepest points on the grade and the heavy machine started down hill at an uncontrollable rate of speed. In order to avoid going over the embankment at the side of the road Jure attempted to run the truck into the bank on the opposite side. It was in so doing that the truck turned over.

Fortunately Jure was not pinned under the wreckage but was thrown a number of feet distant where he lay until picked up by the occupants of another machine which came by shortly after the accident. The truck was not damaged to any great extent and a force of men went to the scene of the accident this morning to bring it down to a garage. Apples were scattered in all directions, as the entire load of about 100 boxes was dislodged from the track.

Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other non-reservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.
