My dear Madam:

I have received your application for the enrolment at Carlisle of your son John, but I have learned that the condition of his health was not satisfactory during his former period of enrolment here and that there was some question about the degree of Indian blood to which he could establish a claim. Under the circumstances I would not be justified in placing transportation for his use.

In order that this matter can be given further consideration will you let me know whether John can pay for his transportation to Carlisle from his own funds.
