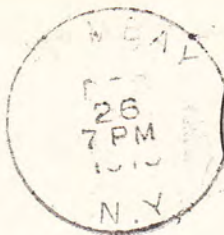

at the present time our milk comes to about 190 lbs a day from five cows at 1.50 a hundred pounds.
