I attended Chillico Indian School, after leaving Carlisle, I was at Chillico from Aug. 29th 1907 till May 11th of 1908, attending the school for the purpose of learning printing trade. etc.

4. What is your present occupation? Salary?

My present occupation is flour packing at the A.C. Mill. my salary being forty eight dollars per month.

5. Do you own your home?

No, I pay so much for boarding etc.

6. What kind of a house is it? Number of rooms?

7. How much property do you possess?

Stock

At my home in Wisconsin I have one horse in my name.

Land

Having allotment of only twenty five acres in my name

8. Do you have money in the bank? *Yes* How much? *Only Ten Dollars*

9. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each? *No*

I never have been in the Indian service.

10. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle?

Since I left Carlisle I came west and have been in the flour mill service most of the time except during bow-ball season, while I go out with a traveling team.

11. Have you done anything for the betterment of your people? Write fully.

No I have not done anything for the betterment of my people, because I'm away from home most of my time, as a result that my people did not wish me to leave home in the first place to attend school, etc.

So in fact I have been obliged to find work else where, but lately realization has over-taken them, now wishing me to return home to stay, which in near future I expect to leave here and return home once more.

Hoping that my help be of some value
to my people in the future.

12. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life.

My experience since leaving Carlisle
has proved to me that it pays to educate the
Indian.

For the reason that it enables him
to go out into the world, to struggle for him-
self, as for me, the benefit I received while
in Carlisle, is that I have no fear to meet my
fellow-men face to face, always ready to hold
my rights, thinking I can do as much as
any average man or more.

I do not hesitate to say that Carlisle
could do any thing better than to keep up its
good work toward educating the Indian,
as far I have seen for myself that schools
on reservations, is only a mere starting
place for self improvement of the Indian children.
