3. Did you attend or graduate from any other schools after leaving Carlisle? Yes. Give names of schools and dates if possible. I attended Haskell Institute, but did not graduate on account of my health.

4. What is your present occupation? A farm hand.

5. Tell something of your present home. I have a good home and am treated as one of the family if not better than I am treated at my own home.

6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings or money do you have? None. I sold my land on account that a person could not make a living in a swamp and I think that the government allotted me the poorest tract of land that could be found.

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each? No.

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle? *I have always worked away from home among the whites on a dairy farm and stock farms.*

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

I came out here in hopes of taking up a home stead. after I sold my land and have worked among the white people so long that I feel more at home than with my own people. because I have seen it with my own eyes that some of the young people come from school and would like to show the old people what they know while they are at school but the old do not want them to have those ways with them so they go back to their old ways again. another thing is while I have worked out among the white people I can draw the same wayes as my white brother and more than some that are in the Indian Service

Can you tell me if I can take up a home stead after selling my allotted land. I am going to try anyway next June at the Rose bud opening. I think I can prove up on a claim as well as the white man. the man that I am working for said I could if I did every thing as good as I do it here I do not know what would bar me from it,
