It was not very long until I became more and more thoughtful as to how I should judge to look ahead again until I found myself up to the standard although I must now look back and ~~thank~~ ^{thank} some person for my success and I will positively admit that it was the instructor and the institution of Carlisle that made me what I am I will always have Carlisle school in mind wherever I go or whatever I undertake and will always be true toward making a name for myself as a one time Carlisle student I have only one regret that I never like to mention and it is that I should have stayed on to Carlisle until I have graduated as I would certainly be far more advanced not only that but I would have had more education combined which is one of the largest mistakes I ever made which I am positive would have some effect later of which I will be sorry if I were to live my life over I would make an effort to have all these combined
