Dear School friends:-

It is with pleasure for me to read the school paper of which I once attended, to hear of so many school mates as well as school friends noticing that some are in the U.S. Army, and elsewhere, I would feel as if I heard from them personally by reading the columns of The Arrow & Redman

When I left the school in year 1900 being in junior class of about forty in number is still in my memory, I went to Portico Rico to a place called Cabonito, between San Juan and Ponce, where I joined 5th, U.S. Cavalry, Troop, "G." was with them nine month when the regiment were ordered back to United States. to Ft Ethan Allen, Vt. Hence I applied for transfer to the squadrons that's going to the Philippines Islands where I stayed two years and came back with honorable discharge. I have been farming ever since and my aim<sup>is</sup> to do more as I have been fortunate to have three healthy boys and three girls of which four<sup>are</sup> going to day school. We are handily

located, the church, school house and cheese factory are all within three fourths of a mile, also on the Mail Route,

**MANY INDIANS ENROLL.**

FORT YATES, N. D., June 22.—If there is anything in a name a number of Sioux Indians who registered here for the army draft should be of material assistance to the government. Among those who enrolled for service are: Love-the-War, Shoots Near, Take-the-Gun, Shoots Walking, Standing Soldier, Did-Not-Butcher, Horse Thief Wounded with Many Arrows, and Taken Alive and Comes Home Alive.
