Dear Mr. Lipps:

After receiving your letter of December 22, 1915, I called Daniel Needham to my office and talked with him concerning his return to Carlisle. His statement is that he returned to Carlisle for an additional year's work, paying his own expenses both ways, and that the unexpired portion of a school year was all that he was under any obligation to serve. Of course I know nothing of the facts. I agree with you that the new regulation or amendment 119(a) applies to this boy's case. However, he does not seem to be at all willing to return to Carlisle. He is anxious to take our business course, he says, although it is doubtful whether he can carry the first year work successfully, entering at this time of the year particularly. Our business department is quite crowded this year and I am not at all solicitous of increasing the enrollment.

It does not seem to me that Daniel will very willingly return to Carlisle, however, and if you care to make a recommendation to the Office, in view of all the facts as you know them, and the Office approves, I will

xtend him the opportunity of trying the business course here. He has not been taken up on our records and will not be without the proper recommendation from you and authority from the Office.

If it is your desire, I shall willingly cooperate with you in an endeavor to get him back to your school to complete his unexpired term or his course there. Possibly, for the sake of discipline, it may be well to advise him to return to his home. You know his record so much better than I do that I shall not attempt to advise. I have no feeling in the matter one way or the other, as he came in without any formalities whatever, and he has no claim on this school for any special consideration.

We also have on file a letter you addressed to me on October 2nd of 1914 in which the following appears:

"As I am anxious to return to school again. I thought I would let you know. I have already signed the application blanks and as soon as my trans. arrives I will start out. I am anxious to return and continue my studies and I hope my transportation will not be delayed in any way."

Our records contain the additional information that the cost of your ticket was paid from Government funds and that you were allowed to go to your home "on leave". -2- Mr. Daniel Needham.

I appreciate fully the position in which you are placed, but that does not alter the situation in any way. The fact remains that you are enrolled at Carlisle and that you should not have gone to the Haskell Institute without consulting Superintendent Dickens and requesting that your permanent release from this school be effected. Your application for enrolment here shows that you are now twenty-two years of age and that fact alone should have been sufficient reason for your finding out whether the authorities at the Haskell Institute desired to secure the special authority from the Commissioner of Indian Affairs required to effect your enrolment.

You had an excellent record at Carlisle and I do not want to deprive you of continuing with your education, but I must insist that you comply with the Regulations that now govern just such cases as yours.

There seems to be a misunderstanding in regard to my enrolling here at this Institution. As I understand it, you are of the impression that I have yet a term to serve at Carlisle, At the close of the school year in the spring of 1914, my term expired and I went home for the summer. I returned the same fall at my own expense and did not sign for another term. I intended to stay only another year as I promised you in the spring, but on account of the illness of my father I was called home, then to return to Carlisle meant more money which I could not afford.

The death of my father has broken up the home, as my mother has been dead many years, and I realize that I must do something by which to make a living, and I have chosen this commercial course as that one thing.

If you have found that I am signed up for a second term at Carlisle, it must be an error because I did not sign any papers upon returning to that school the second time.

I would regret very much if I should be turned away from this school because I am practically penniless and have no home to go to.

Upon finding that I did not sign for a second term at that school, I hope that there is nothing that will hinder you from permitting me to remain here because my record was always clean at that place.

(28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, that hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that-

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.
