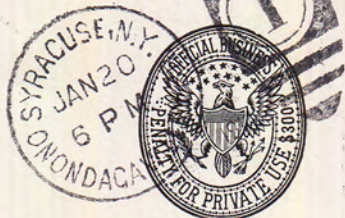

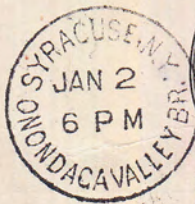

Brown on Thanksgiving Day.
