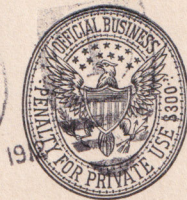

I thank you for your letter of the 7th instant and take this opportunity to assure you that I appreciate the kind words of commendation that are contained in your letter. Noting that you are very anxious to have Carlisle's privileges extended to a boy friend of yours who has made splendid progress in his school work, I regret to state that his enrolment here this year cannot be allowed because he has not reached the required minimum age of fourteen years now specified in the regulations. It will not be possible, therefore, to cooperate with you^x further at this time.
