I can.*

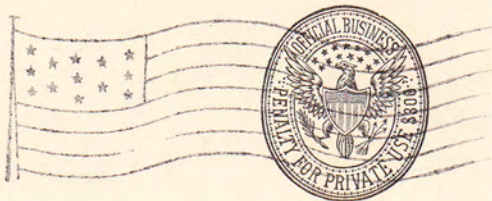
12. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life.

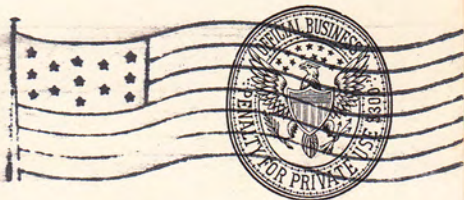
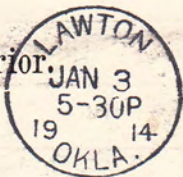

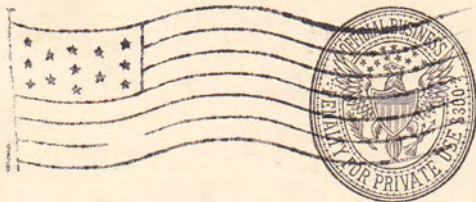
