After reaching home I never lost but very little time, I soon went into the Harness business right a way and sold out and moved out on the farm and have been at work ever since.

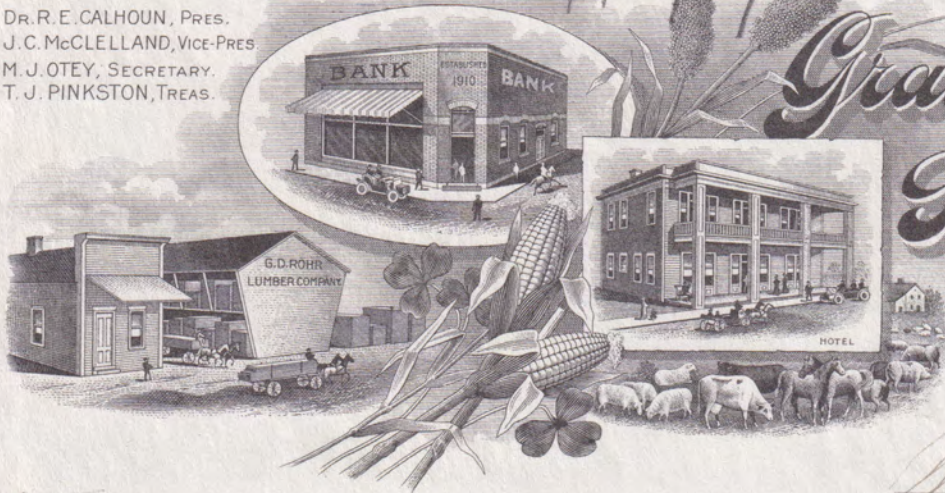
I feel as that my learning while at Carlisle Indian Industrial School was the foundation of my success in life so far.

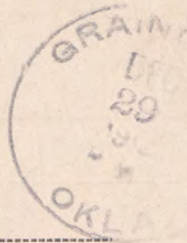
