Dear Mr. Thornton:

With further reference to your letter of October 29 regarding verification of the age of Mr. Loucien H. Dagenette, A-52393, our records show:

A copy of a letter written by Haskell Institute to you indicates that a Lewis Dagnette entered that school in 1892 at the age of 13.

On our Schedule of Allotments the name of Lucien Dagenette, Jr. appears on allotment No. 87 and his age is given as 11 as of October 7, 1891.

Our Carlisle records give the name of Lewis Dagnette, Quapaw Agency, Ottawa tribe, age 17 when he arrived at Carlisle, September 15, 1895. In this same file on a "Record of graduates and returned students" dated August 12, 1910 appears the name of L. H. Dagenette; address: Miami, Oklahoma; married to Miss Ollie Harries of Nashville, Tennessee; attended Haskell Institute and Chilocco Indian School.

On examination of our Census Rolls of the Ottawa tribe for the years 1920 to 1927 we find that Lucien Dagenette's date of birth was 1877; from 1928 to 1934 no record of him is given, but on April 1, 1934 his date of birth is given as April 21, 1873.

From a review of these records it is impossible to state definitely which is the correct date of birth and we regret that we cannot be of more service to you; but in the early days it was rather difficult, in some instances, to get accurate records of the ages of Indians and apparently this is true in Mr. Dagenette's case.

Dear Mr. Thornton:

In reply to your letter of October 29, we wish to inform you that we did have a Louis Dagenette, a one-fourth degree Ottawa Indian from the Quapaw Agency, Seneca, Missouri enrolled at Haskell Institute from March 22, 1892 to September 27, 1898. His age at time of entry was given as 13. However, we do not have a record of date of birth. His mother's name was Martha Clay.

There is no record of a Loucien H. Dagenette having attended her. It might be possible that Louis and Loucien are the same person.

Dear Sir, I wish to extend my congratulations to Carlisle for the many good Advantages that she gave me while I was under its discipline. But am sorrow to say that I did not take the opportunity, as I should. I would like to tell all of Indian boys and girls. To take Advantages of their school days, and make the Best of them while they were young. For if they put it off to long their chances may be gone. So it is as the old saying, make hay while the sun shines.

I just wanted to drop these few lines to my young boys & girls - as I have some of my own, good wishes & success to all Carl.
