I started my schooling at Quapaw Mission S.T. in the year of 1884 I remained until 1888 when I entered Carlisle I remained there till 1896.

4. What is your present occupation? I am farming & growing stock. at present I am working in Blacksmith shop

5. Tell something of your present home my present home is built of logs with frame top I have taken an allotment of 40 acres that I am improving.

6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings or money do you have? I am looking forward to an allotment of 80 acres more 18 mi from here that I have 160 acres fenced improved 6 frame houses on I keep money invested in stock.

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each? I served 3 yrs as assistant Blacksmith & 4 yrs as farmer for Indians 1 yr as boss on casual balance of time on the farm.

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle?

I have had no other position other than those I have mentioned.

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

I ran away from Carlisle in 1896 - June 5.

I was on the road as a hobo, until July 20, when I arrived at Peatullo Idaho. I thought that I sowed all the wild oats that I wanted to last the balance of my days. I think that it did me good. I have an example that I will never forget before me. It has taught me to save what I earn and to earn that that comes my way. I was sorry at the time I left but I am beginning to see that it was more of a lesson to me than what I thought it would be. It was a tough trip. I would advise others not to follow my plans to get on in life. I am comfortably fixed in street houses and land. All of my own earnings went to build up the two places.
