My thoughts often turn back to dear old Carlisle and the kind families I have let live with while out from school especially a family by the name of Woodman's I have been married 11 years and have a nice home two children a boy aged 10, a girl - 8 neither are very stout. we have good district schools through out the county but I am not altogether pleased with statehood so far as the older Indians are concerned as it makes it rather hard for them I hope some day to visit Carlisle it fitted me to make a good living and hold my own with any man. not many white brothers have a better home with all conveniences which I have
