On our way back I had the opportunity to visit China, Japan and Hawaii Islands. Stationed at Fort Riley, Kansas until discharged. I was honorably discharged with character "Excellent."

Last winter I was employed ^{as compositor} in the Moody County Enterprise office at Flandreau, S.D. I then got married and settled down in Milmont, S.D., where I am now employed as a printer in the Roberts County Republican office.
