he was a student in your
school & was there for five
years we used to get regular
letter from him while in
school we heard that
after he left the school
he worked a while for a
Mr. Geo. Brady afterwards
he joined the U.S. Navy
but all this time we never

heard from him for nearly
six years we wrote + inquired
of every bod that ^{ever} knew
him but nobody seemed
to know where he was or about
him we had nearly given him
up as dead in the meantime
you send two letters to Fred
here we was always hoping
against hope that he would
write or turn up so we
kept the letters but didnt
know where to send them
but we were great surprised
one day he wrote to his
mother the letter was
dated July 3, 1911 telling

her all about - himself he had joined
the U.S. navy + served a term. was
~~stationed~~ in the China station
two yrs + a half had been all over
Europe ~~South~~ America Africa ^{Australia}
India + China he had just been out
of the navy about a year + has
been in Washington + California
ever since he is having very hard
luck now has contracted Malaria
Malaria is now in poor health
+ destitute I have been away for
the summer + found three
letters awaiting my return
asking me for money to get home
with I am unable to get enough

money to bring ^{it} home with
for he is ~~married~~ ^{and} + must
have two fares to get here
he went to Cal. to better himself
but his health prevented him
he can only work now + there
as his health permits him
They are really suffering
sometimes can scarcely get
anything ~~to~~ eat very hard to
be so far from home among
strangers + the work is so
cheap if there is any
way you could help him
I would be so glad I have
a large family + have been
sick a good deal they do
not stay in one place but
have to go where ever they

address

for work is scarce + cheap
he keeps us posted where he
