Your circular letter came to hand and contents noted, as I am one of the ex-students of Carlisle I will not have you to wait on me no longer to subscribe for The Arrow and Red-man, The Carlisle Indian Industrial School is the only school that had given me the great self support since I have returned to my Indian reservation, and I have had always the feeling at heart thanks to this dear Carlisle ^{Indian} School for the good education that had taught me. Some few of us the returned students of Carlisle School are doing great help to our tribe of Blackfeet. We were selected by the tribe two years ago as members of Business Blackfeet Council, and since then we have been trying to do all we could to work up money for the

support of our destitute Indians on our
Reservation. Those of the Carlisle Ex-students that
are members of the Business Blackfeet Council
are as follows. Robert J. Hamilton
James C. Grant
Sampson Bird and myself.

I suppose the Carlisle Indian School feels
proud to hear good of us once in awhile
and not only that but it gives the school
good deal more lights to work harder for
the Indians. I have now good ranch, to
farm on, and I have a nice bunch of cattle
and horses. Also good big family.
