SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a nonreservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

If the information called for on any part of the blank is not known, that fact should be stated. No space should be left unfilled. Whether the parents are living or dead, their names must be given.

The person who signs the blank as consenting to the transfer should indicate his relation to the applicant by marking out the word "parent," "guardian," or "next of kin," leaving unmarked only the title appropriate to the signer.

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that—

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case; but in all cases where the parents are living they should first be consulted.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.

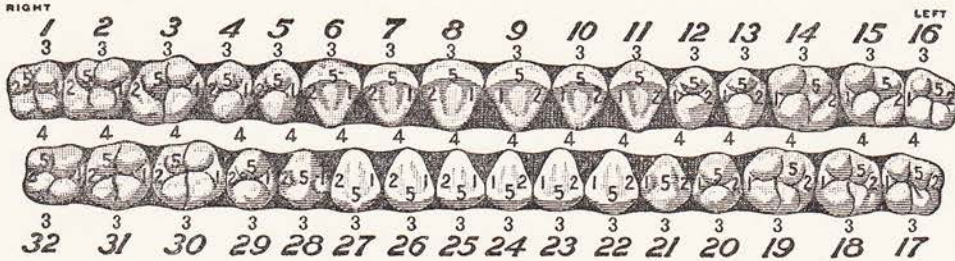

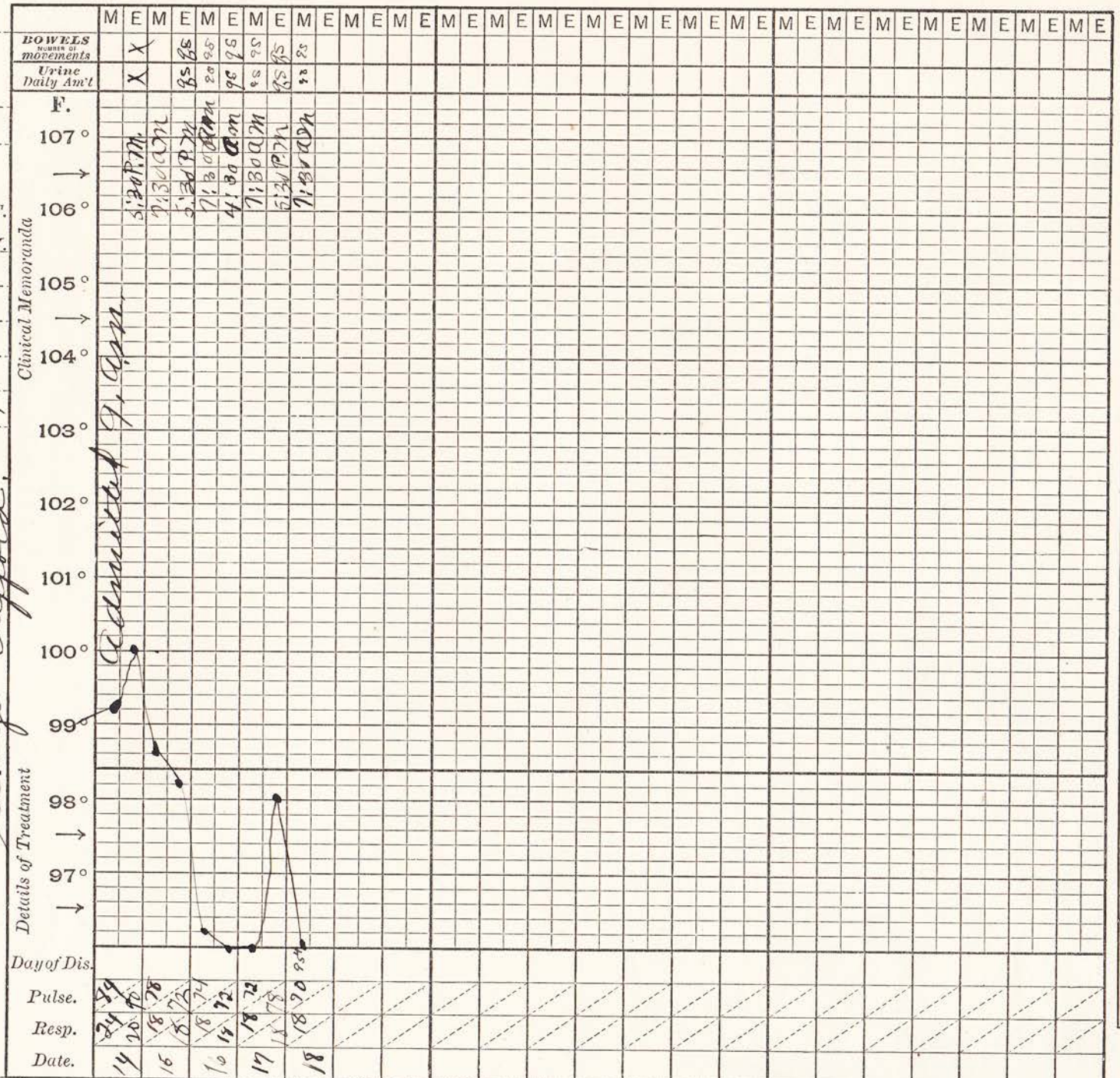

Referring further to my letter of March the 1st, relative to George Clifford, I now report that an amount of \$36.25 has been charged to the account of this school for the ticket that was procured for the young man's use. An amount of \$33.49 was expended from government funds to pay for George's transportation to Carlisle, so that a total of \$69.74 should be sent to me to cover the amounts.

I would thank you to advise me without delay what action may be expected, so that it can be determined how settlement is to be made with the Cumberland Valley Railroad Company, to whom is now due the amount of \$36.25 for the ticket that was used on the 1st instant.



My dear Sir:

I regret very much to inform you that it has become necessary to dismiss George Clifford from Carlisle and that arrangements have been completed to have him leave here this evening. Transportation for his passage to Scenic, S. D., will be provided for his use. He stated that Scenic is the railroad station nearest to his home.

George has given more or less trouble during all the time he has been at Carlisle, which is only since November of last year. Several weeks ago he finally became very drunk. A personal talk with him brought me his promise that he would try to make a better record if I would give him another chance. I agreed to do all I could to help him but on Saturday and yesterday he was again drunk. Believing that at Carlisle nothing can be done for him the drastic action reported above is being taken.

George's brother reports that he was habitually drunk at his home and that the father conceived the idea of sending him to Carlisle to get him away from booze. That being the case,

he should never have been recommended for enrolment here. In fact, a special effort should have been made to keep him away from Carlisle. Now that so great an expense has been incurred to bring him here and his return home must also be effected at government expense it seems only fair that an amount sufficient to reimburse the government for both charges should be secured from the young man's or his father's funds.

Just as soon as it can be determined what the cost of his transportation home is I will write you again and will request that you co-operate with me further as may be necessary.

George told me this morning that he was formerly enrolled at the Rapid City School, and as he had just completed third grade work at that school I cannot understand why his transfer to Carlisle was urged.
