My dear Mr. Dagenette:-

I write you with reference to two of our Carlisle boys who have written to me for work in the Service. One is Chas. Doxtator, an ex-student, who has just been honorably discharged from the U.S. Navy and is now located at 1409 So. 51st St. Phila. He is a shoe and harness-maker, having learned his trade here and worked in Philadelphia after he left the school, at the same trade. He had a splendid record as a student here.

The other young man is Vincente Figueroa, a Porto Rican, mostly Negro, who attended school here until the Porto Ricans were asked to leave when, instead of going back to the Island, he remained in Carlisle. He is a machinist and also a concrete finisher. He is good at the latter occupation and finds steady work in a good season.

I trust you may be able to find some work for these two young men.

to do so

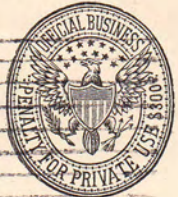
