*Have been in school since leaving Carlisle.*

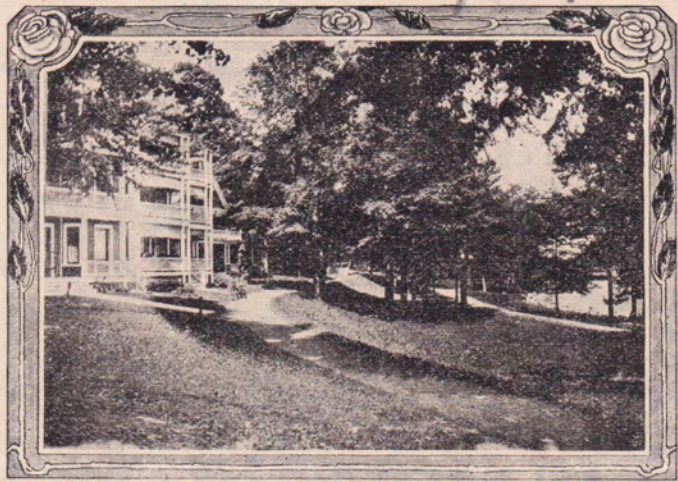
