*I used to work on the Rail-Road "Water-Service" on this line running through Laguna, which was then the "Atlantic & Pacific".*

*I have had always urged my people to send their children to school.*

*I have had held Offices at my Pueblo I was Gov. once and I was send to Washington as a delegate for my Pueblo in 1905. That was the time when Pueblos were exempted from paying taxes.*

*I am sorry that I could not be much assistance to you*

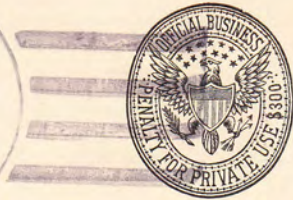
but I feel I must answer in some way. As I have got only a rudimental education (five years, half day schooling) I was one of the first manufactured educated Indian from my Pueblo. When Carlisle was opened for day school. If I had studied more I would have

Anything manufactured at first is not as good as later manufactured & improved. So it is the same with my red brother. Each trying to get better education. So there are more and better educated Indians now <sup>today</sup> who would be of good example & of more assistance to you in your good work, wishing you success in convincing the public what good the education did for us Indians. especially those better educated.
