I had been appointed The Governor for Pueblos of Laguna in 1908 and served two terms or till 1909 or two years.

The Laguna grant have been trying to get the patent years after years by the former Governors, but without success, till later part in 1909 was secured by the aid of U.S. Indian Agent, and attorney. beside there are two small holding land, these are also secured both patents in 1908, and people mostly are farmers, but they have not water

enough for irrigation purposes, and during 1908 being constructed three dams along the creek build by the Government this was a great help to these people. They also used to keep their public fund one or two hundred dollars, years after years. at present they now have \$1234.85 in their fund and cannot mention all have been done during two terms

12. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life after I returned from Carlisle in 1886 at once commenced to cultivate the soil for three years. Then I as I say above there was not water enough for the cultivating land this I quitted then I began to raise cattle and sheep this I had done well, and kept on for four years. after this I started a store at Laguna in company with my father this kept up till 1899 then I removed from Laguna to this place and sold out my sheep of 275 heads to build me a ^{new} home. Indeed I am regret for not getting my education as I remain in Carlisle only one year and ten months. Capt. Pratt. tried hard to let me have full education. but my parents refused, on account of their ignorance, ever since I had in favor in education whenever a chance I found. in 1904 I took a party of 11 to Carlisle another party to Riverside side Cal. another party in 1907 to Haskell Institute Lawrence Kans. this I had done without cost, or with, receiving any pay from any one.
