It is always a pleasure to know of the success and happiness of our former Carlisle students, and as your school father, I desire to congratulate you on the way you are getting on in the world.

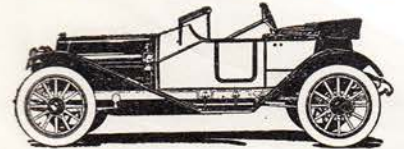

I am glad to say that In my present buisness I can see no Assist-ance that would be a benifit to me in the AUTOMOBILE Buisness that you could render. Thanking you just the same.

I am however planning a new undertaking in which I believe you could assist me greatly and would ask you to send me any-thing that would be Available for you to secure in regard to the Gov't laws of the New York Indians especially the Seneca Nation.
