6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings, or money do you have?

We have only a house, barn out sheds ect, in town that we can call our own for we pay taxes on them. The other land ect, is on the reservation ect,

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each?

Was disciplinarian at Ft Hall from (1898) to (1900) was transferred as District-farmer on reservation, which position I resigned the end of Mar. 1902

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle? Was appointed by

Indians as one of the two delegates sent by them to Washington D.C. to intercede for their rights, the other delegate being selected by the Supt., then in charge.

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

We have been having, and will continue to have trouble with Govt., officials regarding our "rights" We are children and should not be taught to strike back in self defense. We should be made to understand that whenever a mistake is made in Washington that it was the work of some "clerk". Also that the Govt., don't believe in taking land from the Indians but, will pay them for the land, which in the hands of the Indians has a value of from $\$ \frac{25}{100}$ to $\$ 2 \frac{50}{100}$ per acre, which as soon as turned over to the white man, who is a very small fraction of the Govt., but whose wishes when presented by his representatives, in Washington have great weight, this land immediately jumps in value to the sum of from $\$ 75 \frac{00}{100}$ to $\$ 125 \frac{00}{100}$ and still the cry in the Indian office is that the returned Carlisle student is a "kicker" that is the name I have for me. Could write more but will close, with best wishes for the school you self, and others under your charge.
