I understand that James was a pupil here for nearly six years, and that while he was not apt in his studies, he was a splendid boy in every other way. He was faithful, steady and a good worker here as well as under the cutting. Judging from the sentiments he attempts to express in his letter I think that he is making the same kind of a record that he made here and that he is one of the good Indians on the reservation. He is not a graduate.

Please can you tell me about this corner stake what's I found last fall North east from Brush Creek. There was written on the corner stake like this S 23 one the south side of the corner stake on west side $\frac{8}{14}$ on North side 11xC and on East side $\frac{8}{15}$. We do like to have the Public land at Brush Creek. There are pretty good sides country for Seven neu home stead. But we wishes like to have our own land and able to handling the plow handle so far. should be the rights all American Indians who had prior possession the soil. But I am one of the owners of the American soil and asking from you for my own benefit or for my folks. Because my fore fathers was not a foreigners like the white's are now. God created the heaven and the Earth and also created my great grandfather. I was created here on this American soil.

1. Are you married and if so to whom? I have been married Date Sept 16th 1907 and also my baby boy were died shortly after was born Date Aug. 17/1908.

2. What is your present address? My present is at Death Nevada.

3. Did you attend or graduate from any other schools after leaving Carlisle? no Sir Give names of schools and dates if possible I waicnt attend any other school after leaving Dear Old Carlisle.

4. What is your present occupation? Hay, Grains, Sugar Beets and Claim Mineral Rocks.

5. Tell something of your present home I has been living among the white peoples since last two years working for them.

6. What property in the way of land, stock, buildings, or money do you have? We have two hundred an acres of land and it is already cultivated, few head horses few head Cattles and Chickens. This land ours in Utah this land ours wouldnt be proper if five boys live upon the Ceres of land

7. Have you been in the Indian Service? In what positions? How long in each? There is no ind. Service here at Death Nevada except the white Peoples. There is no Military Indians service were I am now at present I suppose what's you asked me about or otherwise you mean the Sunday school and Church. The Church attending same as usual.

8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle?

Has been Farming
ever since returned from school and also
prospected about one Year.

9. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life:

I never did forget Dear
Old Carlisle long I could live upon the World I kind hardly
meditate dear old Carlisle is stand higher than any other
Indians School far she went. The dear old Carlisle do me
very good long as I were attended the school. I was
irrigating the Timidity fields, Grain fields and
Wild hay fields. And my wages are \$45.00 a month, during
the haying time why the wages are \$2.75 per day, I
was chopping the Cedar posts last winter for the farmers
and I did shipped to them about Ten Car loads of Cedar
posts, I get \$1.99 a post. There are 1200 posts in each
Car. I just got letter from Mr J W Buren President
of the Silver Star Mining Company of Nevada. Cobu
Nevada today and also Mr C B Newcombe Secretary
and Treasurer. I got the Certificate for \$850 shares
of the Capital stock of the Silver Star Mining Company
of Nevada issued to Jas M Babawena Dated Jan 1st 1911

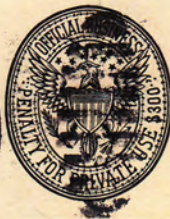
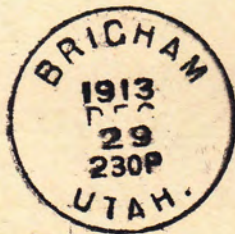
