8. Do you have money in the bank? *Yes* How much? *A small amount, a little.*

I was for a long time a Judge at the U. S. Indian Court at Pine Ridge Agency settling disputes for the Indians.

10. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle? *I was for several years in a trading store, at Pine Ridge Agency, as a clerk.*

My advices and example are influencing my people toward up-lifting themselves and many have become industrious and are very progressive and religious.

12. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life.

Since leaving Carlisle I have always tried to paddle my own canoe without the support of the government. My children can not speak a word of Indian. Carlisle has shown me the way and I am trying to better it.

The seed of Carlisle has taken root and the Indians are clinging to the roots realizing that it is their only salvation, and are fast becoming civilized.

The Indians are glad and appreciated that their children are educated for it makes them civilized, too.
