

There are good many Indians here are joining the American Indian Brotherhood Association.

This association will be a good thing among the Indian not only on this reservation but in United States.

Well! Brothers as you need my help in Commencement time, but if I only know what will my expense be is all I like to know, for this is the best I can do now, so will close with my best wishes to you all in the Carlisle Indian School.
