The signatures of Messrs. Mercer, Wise and Thompson could probably have been secured on a duplicate, but Miss Ely, whose signature also appears on the certificate, died less than a year ago.

Therefore, the liberty has been taken to paste what is left of the original on a copy of a similar certificate and for all intents and purposes it is as good as ever. In fact, it should be of more sentimental value to Mr. Browndog than a duplicate could have been made.

The repaired certificate is being forwarded to you under a separate cover and I would thank you to hand it to the young man who originally earned it with my compliments.
