I have received your letter of September the 10th and am sorry to know that you are unable to work just now because of a sore arm. I hope, however, that you will soon have regained your usual strength and that then you can resume your duties.

I have had inquiry made about the record you had at Carlisle while you were enrolled and have learned that it was a very good one in every way. For that reason I would like to have you return here, but because you are just about twenty-four years of age your enrolment could not be effected without special authority from the Indian Office at Washington. You would also be required to pay for your transportation from your own funds if authority would be granted for your enrolment. Let me know what you desire to have me do.
