I am today writing to Alexander Garlow, Jr., at Lewiston, N. Y. relative to work at Elephant Butte, N. M.

Would one or more of the five boys now at Carlisle or in the outing work care to accept work on the irrigation project at Elephant Butte, New Mexico, being work as laborers at \$1.75 or \$2.00 per day, to be promoted as soon as vacancies occur to positions as machinists or helpers at wages ranging from \$2.50 to \$3.00 per day?

I am one of Carlisle's returned students, and I want to let Carlisle know that I am getting along well. I am working for the Union Carbide Works at Niagara Falls, N. Y.; and I have been working for this company continually for over three years.

I am still interested in Carlisle, and I am pleased to learn that you are trying to raise her standard. There is one thing that causes me anxiety about Carlisle; that is I have a fat bank account over there. When I came away I left my wages in the bank at the administration building; the exact amount I am not quite sure but it is given in the book. Now will you please investigate this

matter for me? I'll be very much obliged to you. Please write to me about it as soon as possible.

My niece Mamie Mt. Pleasant who is now one of your students asked Mr. Friedman, the former superintendent, about this. He just told her that I will have to come and see about it. Now I can not get off from my work very well. Please write and tell me how we can settle the matter. I cannot afford to let a substantial sum of money go astray, especially when I earned it by hard, honest labor. Hoping you success with your new work.

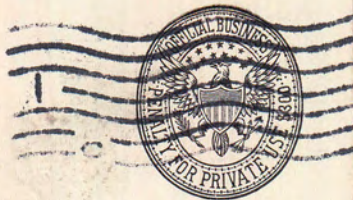
8. What other positions have you held since leaving Carlisle? *I have been a fireman for the Warren Water Co for over four years that is the place you will find my record*
