S. - as a nation are now commencing to feel the immeasurable amount of good that has been done for them by reason of the Government establishing & maintaining all of these schools. The results of these schools and this education is now beginning to show fruit in every State of the Union where Indians live & have their homes & their citizenship.

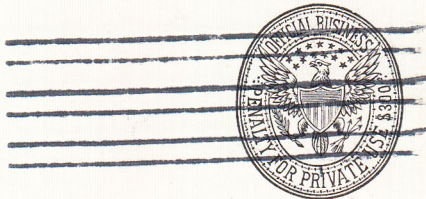
