I have spent the summer doing nothing still at the same time I was at home helping my old folk taking care of the animals and now we are busy making hay for the winter.

I don't hardly think

I will go to school any
more.

I have been trying
to break the lease up of
our land which is
120 a. and they would
not allow this, I wanted
to go on it myself. If
there's any thing you can
do for ^{me} in this request I
would like to have you
do so. The lease for
this land expired last
spring and my mother
lease it again without
my consent.

As I said before
that my two brother were
coming to school there,
I am sorry I told a
story, they can't come
home for Pipestone
Indian School, Minn
so they can't come there.

I am sorry I can't
return to Carlisle this
fall, but am looking
forward to the future
when I will get a
good start for my
self.
