I have your letter asking me to help you get work at the Ford Factory and have to say that the Company has refused to take any Indians now except our regular pupils who go there to take the Students' course. Work is slack just now too. The factory was closed just before Christmas for two weeks and several of our boys came to Carlisle to spend that time. They all say that living in Detroit is very high. Taking everything into consideration I doubt whether it would be wise for you to try to get with this Company now.

Mr. Dagnette has a scheme of placing Indian young men in other automobile factories where they do not have a Students' course and I would suggest that you write to him to help you. We are now preparing our next class which we hope to send out from here in June.

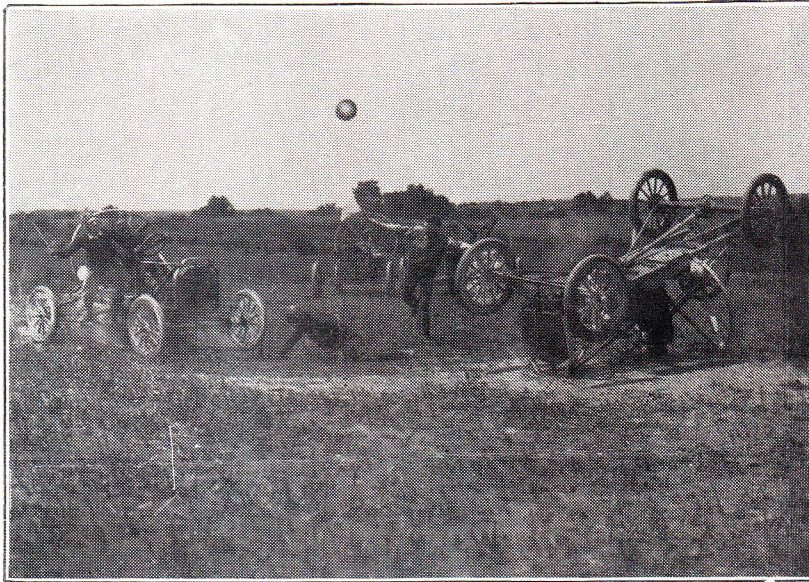

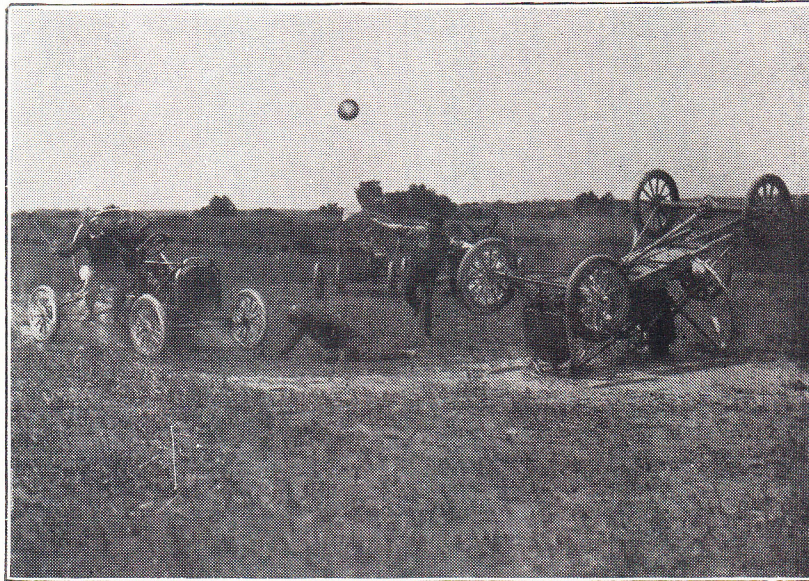
I am a student that left Carlisle about 1909 and have been doing fine ever since I left practically all the educational knowledge I received was at Carlisle of which I am very thankful.

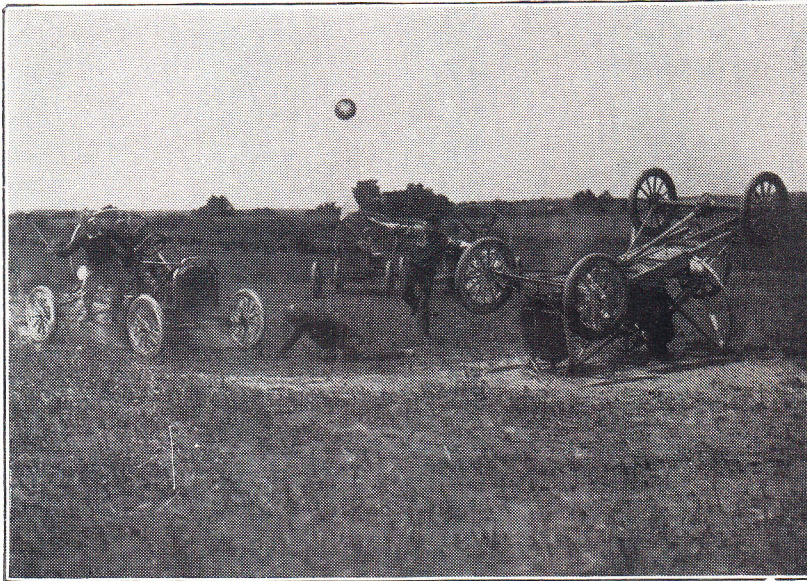

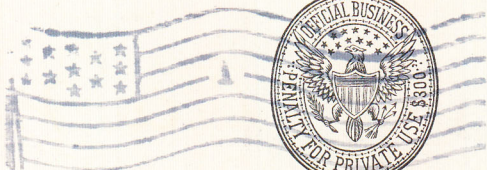
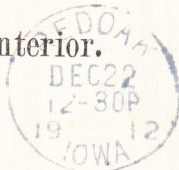
