Dear Sir:

Katie May, one of the Indians under the jurisdiction of this agency, is very desirous of enrolling in one of the Eastern training schools for nurses and in corresponding with the Indian Office concerning the matter it has been suggested that in view of the fact that she has spent six years at Carlisle that the Jefferson hospital of Philadelphia, might afford the opportunity for her to secure training.


While, of course, it is entirely practical and feasible for me to take up this matter direct with this institution, still in view of the fact that this girl has spent so much time at your school and that you have, so I am advised by the Indian Office, several ex-pupils enrolled in this institution, it has occurred to me that perhaps better results could be accomplished if you would assist us by taking up the case with the hospital authorities. Your records will show the time during which this young lady was enrolled in your school, the advancement that she made in her studies and the nature of her department, all of which information I do not possess.

In addition to this information, I have to advise you that I have had the young woman employed as an assistant at the Indian hospital at Lawton, since March 1, 1916, in which position she serves in

the capacity of an assistant nurse and has rendered very capable service, indeed. As a matter of fact it is her service at the hospital which has prompted her desire for definite hospital training.

I trust that you may have the opportunity and be willing to assist me in this matter and should be glad to hear from you at your convenience.

I am in sympathy with the case but I do not believe that we could help you here. It might be possible for you to get her into one of the western school for nurses where the requirements are not so high. If you can think of any way in which Mrs. C. V. Stinchecum, Supt., Kiowa Indian Agency, Anadarko, Oklahoma, I will be glad to.

My dear Mr. Stinchecum:

I am in receipt of your letter dated February 2, 1918 requesting that steps be taken by this school to assist in obtaining an appointment in the Nurses' Training School of Jefferson Hospital for Katie May, a former student.

In response you are advised that our records show that Katie May entered Carlisle in September 1908. She had completed the seventh grade in June 1913 when she left. All of the first class hospitals require a high school education or its equal before admitting girls to the training course. We have had some difficulty in arranging for some of our graduates to enroll as trained nurses by reason of the fact that they will not always give us credit for the industrial courses completed by our students as well as for the academic courses. While Katie May's grades were good during her last year at Carlisle, unless she has had academic training since she left Carlisle she is about five years under the academic standards set by the hospitals. They will require her to submit evidence of her attainments and unless she has attended school since she left here the reference would have to be made from Carlisle and under the circumstances we could not give it.

Katie must be about 25 years old now and could not very well attend school. I can appreciate your interest in her, particularly because her experience as an assistant in your hospital has probably shown you that she has native ability along the line of nursing. However, as a trained nurse in the eastern hospitals is required to take instruction in

Anatomy, Domestic Science, some Chemistry and all of which demand an academic foundation equal to High school training and without it they could not probably do the work.

I am in sympathy with the case but I do not believe that we could help you here. It might be possible for you to get her into one of the western school for nurses where the requirements are not so high. If you can think of any way in which I can help you in this case I will be glad to.
